To apply for an internship for academic credit, you must complete this contract and return it to Navin Bapat (bapat@email.unc.edu). Internships must be pre-approved for academic credit. Actual enrollment in PWAD 393 will normally be deferred until a regular fall or spring semester after the completion of the internship. Registration for PWAD 393 is controlled and will be done by Shakierah Clark (shaclark@ad.unc.edu).

Sponsorship of Internship

The work or mission of the organization or institution sponsoring the internship must be meaningfully connected to the problems of peace, war, or defense. It is entirely the student's responsibility to find her or his own internship. PWAD does not serve as a placement service for students wishing to pursue internships.

Faculty Supervisor

Dr. Navin Bapat (bapat@email.unc.edu) will oversee the academic component of the internship. Students will be required to submit a journal chronicling their internship work, as well as copies of any work completed (where possible) to be evaluated at the end of the semester. The internship will be graded on a PASS/FAIL basis only. Credits, therefore, cannot be applied to the major.

Other important information:

The internship must involve at least 100 hours of work.

Some form of on-site supervisor evaluation of the intern must be received for credit to be granted.

Both the student and the faculty supervisor must sign the contract proposal.

PWAD 393 satisfies the Experiential Education requirement of the College of Arts and Sciences.
